Department Commandant chose the recipient and later a Society of previous recipients chose the next recipient.

Victor is wearing a blue tux because back in the day formal dress was the uniform of the day. Not everyone had dress mess uniforms.

Later National adopted this award. It still hold the prestige of being one of the highest award you can receive in our League. Many hold it in the same regard as they do Marine of the Year. A smaller group of Marines are eligible to receive this award than MOY.

24. Victor received an Commendation from the State of New York for his service to our country and the league.





26. Victor also received many awards from our league for his service including the distinguished citizen's gold which is the highest award in our league.



The above is what is written in Enclosure 4 of the National Bylaws.

The question comes to mind, who was Victor T. Fisher and why was this award named after him. This information is what I have discovered in the past few months. I interview several Marines and received many stories all positive. Time has pasted there are still many blanks to be filled in. Here is what I know to be true.

Marine Fisher was a long time Sgt at Arms for both the Department of New York and Marine Corps League National. Victor was a Marines, Marine and totally squared away. He was totally dedicated to being the best Sgt. at Arms that he could be. He was never political and never ran for any other office and was totally dedicated to position of Sgt. at Arms. Victor was a always a true Gentleman and could get Marines to comply with regulations and like it. He was never a Devil Dog as that would take away from the job he loved. He did his job so well that he received many awards, National Marine of the Year 1992, Honorary Commandant Department of New York, A commendation from the State of New York for his service to our Country and the League. Department of New York Marine of the Year. Distinguished Citizen Gold.

Marine Fisher is remembered for his sword salute which he rendered for each fallen Marine at the Memorial Service at the National Memorial Services that he organized and so proudly took part in. Victor was also a mentor to many but was a special mentor to Marine Penny Weston. When the Marine Corps League New York got licenses plates Victor got plate number 10, June Fisher, Victor's Wife gave that plate to Penny when Victor Passed. Penny still keep a picture of Victor inside her red jacket to always remember Victor. They were very close friends. She and

How did the award come about? Before about 2010 there was no Division Marine of the Year award so the Department of New York came up with the first Victor T. Fisher award for the Northeast Division Marine of the Year. The Commandants of the Departments in the Northeast Division selected the first recipients and later a society was formed to select next recipient.

Sometime later National took note of this award and adopted it as we know it today. On the Plaque Victor is wearing a blue Tuxedo, I really don't know why for sure but I do know that in those days sometimes Tuxedoes they were wearing to banquets or it could be because he looked so good in it.

When I began this search for information about Marine Fisher I had no idea I would receive this award at the Southern Division Conference.
