"The 29th of March 2023 is the 50th anniversary of the end of America's involvement in the Vietnam War. Let us all take this opportunity to recognize and honor our Vietnam era Veterans.

"Why March 29th?" First, March 29, 1973, was the day U.S. Military Assistance Command, Vietnam was disestablished. In addition, March 29, 1973, was the day the last U.S. combat troops departed Vietnam. Finally, March 29, 1973, was the day Hanoi released the last of its acknowledged prisoners of war. There were 58,202 United States military service men and women that died during the Vietnam War. There were approximately 268 Medal of Honor recipients during the Vietnam War. The war took place from August 5th, 1964, and officially ended on April 30th, 1975.
