

### 4. PROJECT SPOTLIGHT— Liam Murphy

Local Eagle Scout Liam from Clearville, Pennsylvania is a loving, and compassionate young man who enjoys all aspects of Scouting, and also has a deep passion and desire to help Veterans and first responders who suffer from Post Traumatic Stress (PTS). Liam, who at an early age already knew that giving back to the local community is what he really wanted to do, but was somewhat unclear as of what path he would go, but that would all change the moment he meets Ryan Decker who owned a small non-profit business called "last line". Ryan's intention was to build and place small little homes on his land with hopes that these homes together would offer a place of tranquility and quiet peaceful solitude. A place where a Veteran can go and escape the pain and horrible realities that are associated with PTS. It was then that Liam knew what was missing in his project plan. His Family had an old camper, which was donated to Liam for his project, along with material from local business that would be used in creating a small, but spacious getaway. From the ground up, a great deal of time was spent redesigning the floor plan, which involved plumbing, new windows, heater, refrigerator, new wiring, new siding, and roof, not to mention the detailed interior, finally the decorations. It took a total of 762 hours to complete this wonderful retreat. During this transformation from becoming an old camper to a private cozy little getaway would not only become a dream come true for Ryan, becoming his first retreat home, which was donated by Liam, but it would also create a bond between an Eagle Scout named Liam and a Veteran named Ryan.

A Scout must complete a well designed and carefully planned Eagle Project, these projects should benefit and have a long lasting impact in their local community, group, or entity. They must be approved by the troop and District committee before construction begins, and once completed, an official who witnessed the project could vouch that this project meets all the rules set forth, as complete, would then sign off.
