Emma Irene Bryfogle Eagle Scout project and Court of honor Photos

Emma Irene Bryfogle, who is a senior at Palmerton High School, also who is a member of Troop 20 from *Minsi trails Council* from Carbon-Luzerne County mentioned that local nonprofit organization, "Family Promise" of Carbon County who specifically targets to prevent homelessness for families with children has benefited from Emma's Eagle Scout project.

Emma's project involved three steps, first was to prepare the basement of the church next door to the Family Promise building in Nesquehoning, PA, by giving it a fresh coat of paint. next was the need to purchase materials that would be used to assemble 24 winter survival kits for the homeless people who would be using the church as a warming shelter. Emma's dad Troy Bryfogle assembled two- nine hole cubicles, which were then delivered to Family Promise and used as a storage unit in the warming shelter.

Finally Emma donated feminine hygiene products and ready to eat meals.

Emma's project took about six weeks to plan and complete. Emma is so thankful for everyone who had a part in helping her with her Eagle Scout project, which consisted of 21 volunteers, ranging from classmates, family, friends, and other Scouts. In-addition she said none of this would have been possible without her parents, (Melissa Fredericks) Emma's Mom for taking her everywhere she needed to go, and her dad for assembling the cubicles.

Throughout my scouting experience, I've traveled to various places for summer camps and merit badge work, gaining hands-on skills and experiences that have shaped me into the leader I am.






