Winter Quarterly Report

This Quarter has been a fun filled Quarter finishing a few tasks that needed tending to, continue/maintaining the Winners listing for all those lucky Lottery Calendar winners and making my share of mistakes (ok – only one that was corrected) along the way, shifting unsold calendars to those in need (mailing calendars is quite expensive now-a-days), learning to get the spreadsheet up and running as it should and making sure all cards are entered as I receive them. That being said let's see some numbers to back that:

100% of the calendars were distributed and to date (not including what is sitting at Headquarters waiting for this weekend) 76.4% (764) calendar stubs have been received and entered into the LIVE spreadsheet, meaning there are still 23.6% (236) stubs or unsold calendars waiting to take their rightful spot on the spreadsheet.
